### SEARCHING FOR A NEW PASTOR

What happens when a pastor retires? Just what is involved in the search for a new pastor, and how quickly can we get that done?

The church must follow the process established by the Presbyterian Church USA as administered by our presbytery, the Presbytery for Southern New Jersey. Before Pastor Dana retired, the presbytery appointed a representative to help us through this process. Our representative is the chair of the Committee on Ministry (COM), Wendy Frisby, who will guide us through the entire process. She attended a session meeting in the summer to speak to us and give us information.

Then our Worship and Pulpit Supply chairperson, Liz Braun, was permitted to secure pulpit supply preachers for at least the first two months after Pastor Dana's retirement. Liz had arranged the services of Jim Kraft for the first three Sundays and Paul Fenn for the fourth Sunday, not only for the first two months but for as long as we need them. We are blessed to have these two helping us through our time of transition. (cont. p. 2)

After Dana's retirement, the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry (COM) appoints a moderator for the session. At present, no moderator has been appointed for our session. We still held our September session meeting and shared committee and treasurers' reports; however, we will need a moderator to make and pass motions.

Once session has a moderator (who must be an ordained Presbyterian minister), we can begin the process of searching for a new pastor. The first step is to conduct a mission study. The session needs to appoint a Mission Study Committee (MSC) of 5-7 people, including one or two session members and the other members from the congregation. We will need 3-5 members of the congregation to serve on this committee. Not until the Mission Study is completed and the session and presbytery have reviewed and approved their report can we begin the actual search for a new pastor.

When the mission study is completed, the committee's report will be sent to session and to the COM for review and, ultimately, approval. Since we share a pastor with Oak Grove Presbyterian Church (OGPC), a mission study must also be completed by their MSC and approved by their session and the COM before we can move on to the next step.

At this point, the COM will give permission for the congregations to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). For us, this will be a joint committee, having representatives of both churches. The members of the PNC need to be elected by the congregation at a congregational meeting.

Right now, the session can do little until we get a moderator. Doug Cramer, a member of the OGPC session, went to the presbytery offices last week. He talked to Kathy Dain, the new executive presbyter, about our situation, and she would like to meet with both sessions on October 28. We are hopeful that this meeting can help us speed this slow process along.

One thing we can do is line up the members of the Mission Study Committee so they can get started once everything else is in order. We cannot begin searching for a pastor until the mission studies are completed. We need volunteers from the congregation to be part of the Mission Study Committee. Please contact Liz Braun or Judy Ross if you are interested.

The search for a new pastor is not a quick process. We need prayer and patience and volunteers!

# PEACE AND GLOBAL WITNESS OFFERING

The Prophet Zechariah had a vision for peace, for a world where each person — all ages, all genders and races, all nationalities — can live without hatred, enmity, fear, and destruction. In Zechariah's vision there is "a sowing of peace," where the world is restored, made whole, and abides in peace.

Peacemaking is central to the gospel and mission of the church. Peace is possible, and it starts with us sowing the seeds of peace in every interaction and decision we make.

The Peace and Global Witness Offering is one way we can begin to bring peace. This is the third of the four nationwide special offerings of the Presbyterian Church USA and is received on World Communion Sunday, October 6.

This offering is used for a wide variety of peacemaking efforts and is divided as follows: 50% to international peacemaking programs, 25% to peacemaking efforts within our region of the US, and 25% for a local peacemaking program chosen by the session. For the past few years, our session has given our portion to Providence House Domestic Violence Services.

### CHURCH FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Although income in July and August was less than expenses for those months, income for the year remains greater than expenses.

Treasurer Jim Ross, with session's approval, transferred funds from the TD Money Market fund to our CD, which pays 4.25% interest, much higher than the Money Market's .03% interest rate.

Building Fund Summary: As of September 30, a total of \$15,855.00 has been donated (JPC and Oak Grove) and \$12,478.04 has been spent.

### MORE MANSE REPAIRS NEEDED

The replacement of the door and windows on the manse are only the beginning of the work that needs to be done.

### **DEACONS FUND**

The Board of Deacons was merged into the Session last year, but the Deacons Fund remains, now one of the church's funds (like the Building Fund). The Deacons Fund Offering is officially received the first Sunday of each month, but donations at any time are welcome.

Each month the Deacons Fund donates \$300.00 to the Christian Caring Center (CCC), \$100.00 to Bridge of Hope, and \$40.00 to World Vision to sponsor a child. The fund also provides Tom Dickson with \$85.00 most months to buy hoagies for the lunches we take once a month to the Christian Caring Center. When the CCC gives out food baskets at Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas, a larger donation is made because of the increase in number of lunches needed.

The fund pays for various things for the church, such as flowers for Mother's Day and baptisms, food to fill the church emergency food pantry, and more.

In addition, the fund is available to help out church and community members and friends who need emergency help paying for such things as medication and utility bills.
